

This definitely would benefit everyone in our community. I especially think it would be enticing in the summer months if our play structures have shade built in to keep everyone cool during those hot months.

Lastly, as I already mentioned, my Traver residents have limited options when it comes healthy activities. We currently only have one play structure in our primary playground and no playground structure for our upper grades. The school is the lifeline for the community and I believe the more options I can present to the community in the way of wellness, will only help our community to get out of the house and be active. I am very grateful that the Kingsburg Tri-County Health District is helping school districts achieve this very thing.

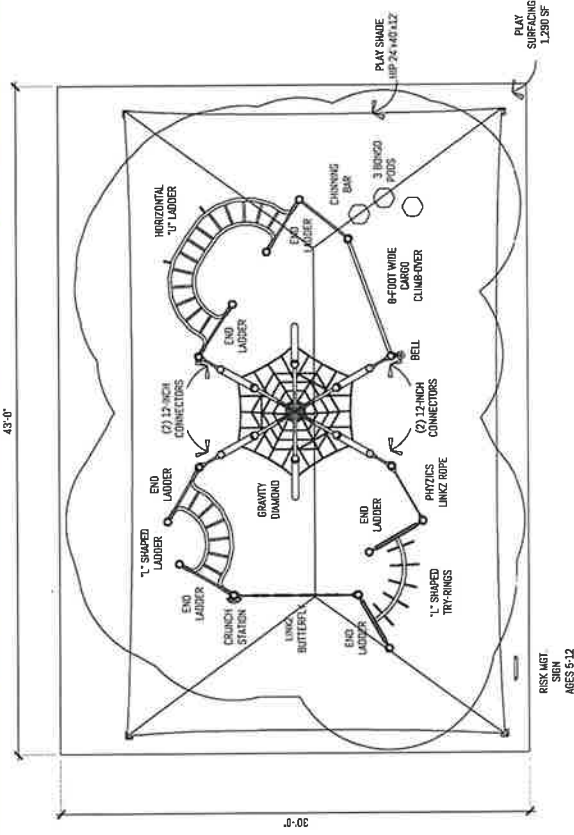

8. Plans

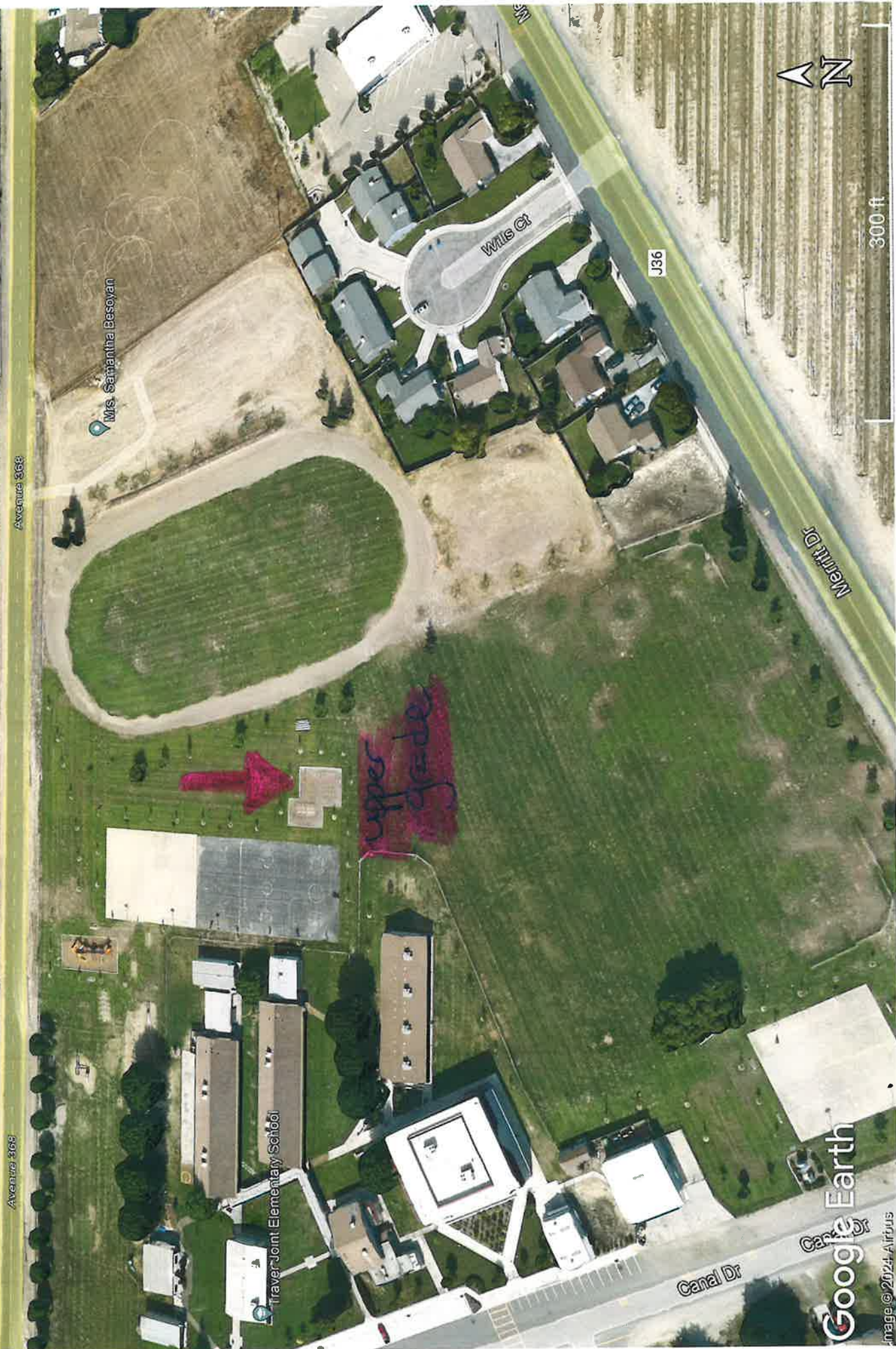
The new play structure would replace an old sand pit in the upper grade play area. The district will remove all sand and prepare it for the playground structure. The picture provided shows the area it would be installed.
