Grant Overview - Lincoln School Garden Revitalization Project

Following discussions with teachers and administrators at Lincoln School and the Kingsburg Elementary Charter School District Superintendent, the Kiwanis Club of Kingsburg is submitting this grant application aimed at improving and sustaining the already established school garden at Lincoln School. This project aligns with our club's mission to help improve the world one child and one community at a time. Improving and being able to sustain the already existing Lincoln School garden will provide Lincoln students with a holistic education, promoting health and wellness among not just students, but also their families and the broader community. Study of the ecosystems and plants are also included in the Next Generation Science Standards and expectations for students in grades two and three.

Currently, the garden is in need of a lot of repair, upgrading and maintenance. Below is a detailed description of how the funds will promote health and wellness and further the grant goal of fostering quality health services and programs benefiting the Lincoln School Community and Kingsburg Community in general:

Sensory Garden Features: These features will provide a transformative space for children, especially those with special needs. Features that appeal to the five senses is important and provides therapeutic benefits, as well as fosters the emotional and psychological well-being. Features provided through this grant include, wind chimes, fountain, flowers and plants with contrasting elements of color, form, movement, light, shadow, texture, and smell. All of these features will promote a holistic sensory experience for those who visit and work in the garden. The sensory garden features will also provide visitors with therapeutic benefits, reducing stress and anxiety levels and promoting mental well-being among students and educators alike.

Vegetable and Herb Garden: The grant will provide materials for a vegetable and herb garden where students will experience hands-on nutrition learning, learn about healthy eating habits, healthy foods and snacks, and the importance of agriculture in the valley. In 2017 Columbia University did a study with results indicating students who were provided lessons connected to school gardens were three times more likely to eat more fruits and vegetables than those students without a school garden, regardless of whether or not that food was grown in the garden at school or came from the store.

Create Raised Garden Beds: These help promote hands-on learning about gardening, plant growth and sustainability. This also provides better access for students who have difficulty working on the ground. (For example, students in wheelchairs.) Raised garden beds also offer numerous advantages, including improved soil quality, better drainage, weed control, and pest management.

Educational Signage: Signs throughout the garden will provide more information about the different plants, insects, and wildlife that may live in the garden, as well other interesting information. This will help inspire students to learn more and explore the garden at school and in other places.

Library/Resource Books and Reading Material: Increase the number of nature-themed books in the library and classroom to encourage independent reading and curiosity about gardening and the natural world. Resource books and lessons for staff to use with students.

Seating Areas: Funds from the grant will be used to create outdoor classroom spaces, including comfortable seating and work areas with benches and picnic tables where students may gather for lessons and discussions. We will be creative in this area and work to maintain the natural feel and integrity of the garden space.

Pathways: Creating pathways with durable materials such as gravel, stepping stones, and wood chips which provide clearly defined pathways that will make it easier for students to navigate through the garden.

Sustainability: Students will be introduced to sustainable gardening such as compost bins to help reduce carbon emissions and rain barrels that capture rainwater from the roof that would otherwise become runoff.

Community Wellness Events: The school may host community wellness events or workshops in the garden that involve students, families, staff and the broader community. This could include nutrition workshops, gardening seminars, a farmer's market, recipes featuring vegetable and fruits dishes from different cultures, and cooking demonstrations. The Kiwanis Club of Kingsburg will support the school garden program through volunteerism during the regular school year and summer, as needed and recommended by the school. Members will volunteer to help maintain the garden when students and staff are not available. The garden may also be used for afterschool and summer programs.

Garden Materials and Student Responsibilities: The grant will provide materials and age appropriate resources for students to care for the garden. This will promote physical activity, responsibility, and a sense of ownership over their garden space. Chores and responsibilities include rakes for smoothing the soil, shovels for building beds and digging holes, hand trowels for digging and planting, hoes for weeding and making planting furrows, etc.

Consultant: For planning and design of the school garden. Club members will serve as consultants, as well as other members of the larger community, including parents who may be experts in this area.

For many students seeing vegetables growing in a garden or eating something freshly picked is rare. Children will be able to experience the rewards of fresh produce and the process that brings them to the table. They will learn how plants grow from seeds to sprouts to flowers and to fruits. Students will learn the impact nature has on plant life and experience the connection between nature and their own food supply, as well as the school garden ecosystem and the pollinators and other creatures it supports. Through their participation in the school garden, students will develop a sense of connectedness to their school and develop a greater

appreciation and respect for nature and the world around them. The Kiwanis Club of Kingsburg will work with the school and district to create a dynamic learning environment that inspires curiosity, fosters environmental stewardship, and promotes hands-on exploration of the natural environment.

The Kiwanis Club of Kingsburg will support the Lincoln School Garden Project through members volunteering their time and expertise to improve and maintain the school garden. This hands-on approach will not only beautify the outdoor space, but also provide invaluable learning opportunities for students, fostering a deeper connection to the nature, promoting environmental stewardship, and building community.

Objectives:

1. **Enhance Garden Infrastructure:** Our volunteers have worked alongside the school community to assess and address any structural or aesthetic improvements needed in the garden, such as adding raised beds, creating a workspace for students where students will take ownership and be proud of their accomplishments, creating and adding signage for educational purposes, providing an environment where the school community can thrive.
2. **Cultivate Garden Beds:** With a focus on sustainability and biodiversity, club members will assist in planting a diverse array of flowers, vegetables, and herbs, enriching the garden with vibrant colors and enticing aromas while providing hands-on learning experiences for students.
3. **Implement Maintenance Plan:** To ensure the long-term viability of the garden, our volunteers will collaborate with school staff to develop a maintenance plan tailored to the needs of the space, including watering schedules, pest management strategies, and seasonal upkeep tasks.
4. This project will provide a model for use at other schools.

Lincoln School Garden Revitalization Project

Previous Funding Sources

Previous, student body funds and private donations were used to support the Lincoln School garden. So while our student body efforts got us started, we now find ourselves in a position to find other ways to keep our garden growing. At the heart of the issue lay the harsh reality of financial constraints. Student body budgets are tightened and priorities shifted. The once-ample resources are dwindling. Student body funds are no longer enough to support nourishing the garden's growth and expansion, which includes sensory features, sustainability, and a living classroom space where students will thrive and have fun.

Lincoln School Garden Revitalization Project

Community Need

Imagine a place where learning includes daily sunshine, where kids get their hands dirty and their minds are buzzing with excitement. A place where students can reflect, relax, enjoy nature and learn at the same time. That's the vision behind our school garden revitalization project.

As we address these specific needs, the school garden revitalization project will not only provide students with great opportunities for learning and fun, but also contribute to the overall health and well-being of students and the community.

Below is a description of the specific needs of the District which this project will address.

Nutrition Education: Students will learn about healthy eating habits and the importance of fresh fruits and vegetables in their diet. This project will foster a deeper appreciation and understanding of nutrition and healthy food choices. Food plays a vital role in preparing children to learn and attend school each day. Research shows that students eating habits and healthy behaviors are connected to academic achievement. An example of this would be the school breakfast programs which are associated with reduced absences, increased memory, and the ability to retain information.

California Science Expectations for 2nd and 3rd Grade

Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math Education (STEM):

All of these disciplines will be integrated into the school garden lessons. The second and third grade Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) specifically include the study of ecosystems and plant growth. A school garden will provide students with hands-on learning experiences that meet state expectations. Students will learn and have fun at the same time!

Environmental Education: School garden hands-on lessons will address the growing concerns for environmental sustainability, such as composting and water conservation.

Health and Wellness: The project will include sensory garden features. These features will include features that address the five senses and foster the emotional and psychological well-being of students and the school community. School gardens also promote community engagement and bring students, teachers, families, and local residents together. It's a place of intergenerational learning and fosters a sense of pride and ownership within the community. Spending time outdoors in nature has also been linked to reduced stress and improved mental health.

Life Skills: Students will learn life skills such as responsibility, teamwork, and problem-solving. These skills are essential for success both in and outside of the school environment.
